- Ensuring continuous improvement and high standards of health and safety in the club for all members, players, coaches, supporters, staff, contractors and visitors.
- Creating a healthy and safe environment for all members, players, coaches, supporters, staff, contractors and visitors.
- Complying with all relevant legislation, regulations, codes of practice and safe operating procedures and ensuring all our members and guests are safe at our club.

Health and safety is a shared responsibility of Nomads United AFC, Nomads United AFC Members, all players, coaches, match officials and supporters.

Nomads United AFC is committed to and responsible for:

- Encouraging players and members to participate in identifying hazards and developing and maintaining appropriate safety procedures.
- Having a system in the committee system that involves players in a health and safety forum, and allows for health and safety representation.
- Promoting health and safety in the club by providing players /coaches with information and training of committee members in health and safety, first aid; and on actual and potential hazards.
- Actively working to reduce, and where possible prevent, accidents and injuries that occur in the workplace.
- Developing management systems which ensure that effective health and safety procedures are in place and are operating correctly.
- Ensuring accidents and incidents are accurately reported and recorded.
- Supporting the safe and appropriate early return to work of any injured employees.
- Ensuring that committee members and executive committee members have a leading role in the management of health and safety, and that managers and senior staff are able to demonstrate a level of competence in health and safety management.

Nomads United AFC players are responsible for:

- Going about their playing routine in a safe and healthy manner and ensuring that their actions, or any lack of action, does not harm anyone including themselves.
- Making themselves aware of the emergency procedures at their club and other location of play
- Identifying and reporting all hazards
- Following instructions regarding hazards and reporting any unsafe conditions in the club immediately
- Reporting accidents and incidents immediately to the Health & Safety Officer.
